Reflection Time

Reflection of learning is a fantastic tool we can use to encourage our children to think more deeply about their learning. Reflection of learning involves students thinking about what they have read, done, or learned, and considering what can be learnt from this experience, to further grow and develop. As adults we often do this: how many times do you go over something again in your mind, and can see where you have done well, could have improved, or even changed something to make it better? Encouraging children to do this helps them to develop this way of thinking.

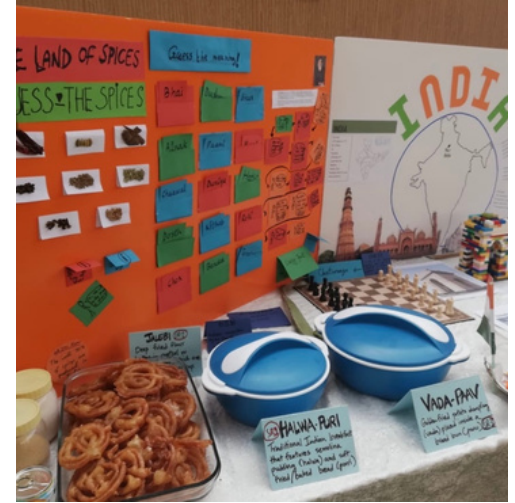
Why not try reflecting on the day's learning? You could ask your child these questions:

- What did you enjoy most about the learning today?
- Can you share something that that you learnt today that you didn't know before?
- What did you find the most difficult today? What could we do to help with this?
- When do you think you were learning at your best today? Why?
- Do you think there is any of your learning we need to look at again?
- What made you curious today?

Spotlight On... Noorah and Nawwarah

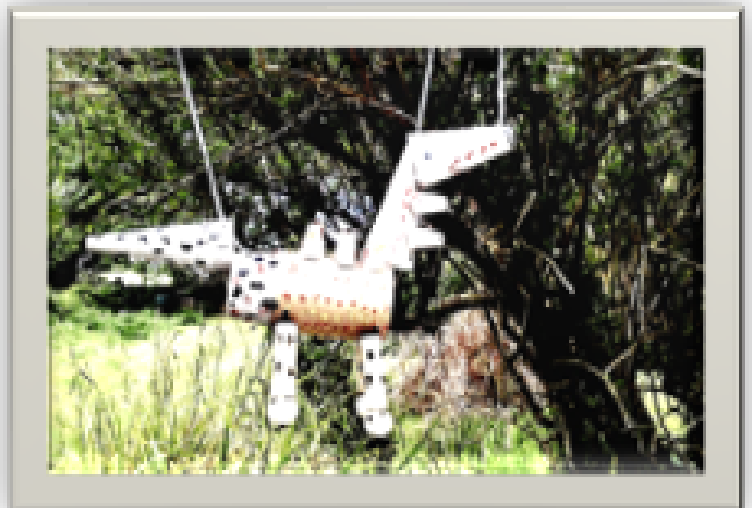
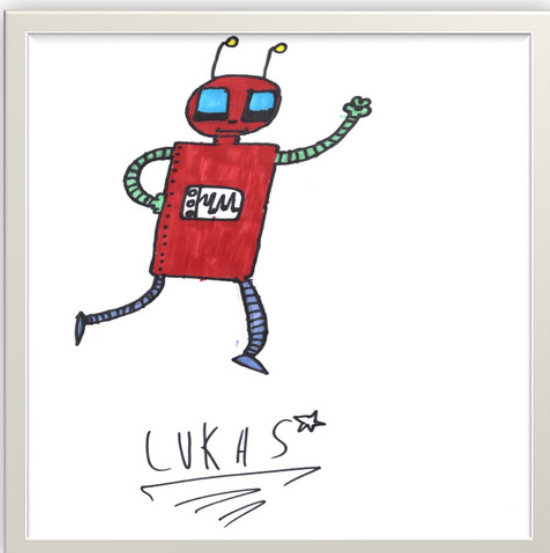
Noorah, age 7, and Nawwarah, age 5, from Saudi Arabia have been creating a display about India for a World Culture Day exhibition.

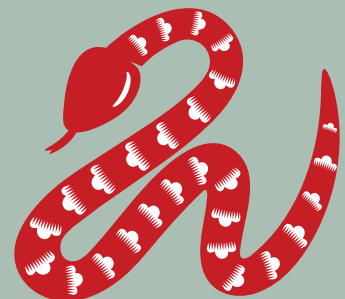
