Art Club Cookery Club Creative Writing Club Lego Club Nature Club


















Our Chess Club will continue to run where you can play Wolsey Hall students of all ages. Our new Show and Tell area encourages you to share your achievements with us.

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Can you be an Eco Warrior?

In many schools around the world, student Eco Warriors are busy looking for ways to help their schools be more environmentally-friendly, as well as reminding all their peers how they can help to save the planet at home. If we all make small changes we can work together to improve the world we live in. The term Eco Warrior is used in schools to describe a person actively involved in preventing damage to the environment. Can you be a Wolsey Hall Eco Warrior? Can you think of ways to help look after our planet? Think REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE.

- REDUCE: can you use less of our natural resources in your daily life? Do you remember to turn off the lights when you leave a room? Do you remember not to leave the water running when you brush your teeth? Do you close the door when you leave the room to keep the heated or cool air in the room? Can you have less food waste at home?
- REUSE: Do you make sure you have bags that you can use again and again? Do you take a cup or flask with your drink in rather than buying a new bottle or carton of drink each time you go out? If something breaks, can you repair it rather than throwing it away and buying a new one?



• RECYCLE: Some of the things that you can recycle are cardboard, paper, textiles, electronics, metals, plastics, and glass. Examples of recycling include participating in a local recycling program, taking recyclable items to the recycling centres, and finding retailers that accept things like used plastic bags, cell phones, batteries, and paint cans. You can pass on your old clothes to charity shops. Do you recycle enough? Could you do more?

These are just three areas where you can play your part as a Wolsey Hall Eco Warrior. There are so many more ways that you can help to look after our environment. Can you think of any?



Our new ePortfolio storage space for students


We would like to share with our families the ePortfolio facility that we have on our Canvas learning platform.

On Canvas, the ePortfolio allows students (with parental help) to store examples of their work. You may create a new ePortfolio each year if you wish, and for each subject you take.

ePortfolios can be set to allow private or public access (if you wish to share with friends in Wolsey Hall). Common uses of ePortfolios are to show your projects, photographs achievements, experiences, and other work.

Your ePortfolio is YOUR space to use for your own personal storage of Wolsey Hall related files and documents of your learning - your Tutors and SPMs will not be checking your ePortfolio.
